## A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR



### Pastor's Desk May 2008

Last month I wrote an article on Spiritual Gifts. Here is a second installment on this most important subject.

1 Corinthians 12: 1, 7-11

*Now about spiritual gifts, brothers, I do not want you to be ignorant....*

*Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. To one there is given through the Spirit the message of wisdom, to another the message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit, to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he gives them to each one, just as he determines.*

Paul writes to the church in Corinth, "Now about spiritual gifts, brothers, I do not want you to be ignorant..." It is a terrible problem if a Christian doesn't know what spiritual gift(s) they have been given. Imagine if you gave a friend a brand new vehicle that perfectly suits

them and even after several years the person hasn't driven it anywhere. In fact they haven't even acknowledged that they received the gift of the new vehicle at all. What would you say to your friend? "Hey, how is your new vehicle, has it served you well?" You can imagine how strange it would be for your friend to say to you "What vehicle?." Unfortunately many Christians don't have the foggiest idea what gifts the Holy Spirit has given them to serve and build up the church and the family of God.

Verse 11 states clearly, the Spirit gives spiritual gifts to each Christian, just as he determines. You have one or more gifts especially picked out by the Holy Spirit so you will boldly build up the church. Someday you will be having a little talk with the Lord about our gift and he will ask us "how did you do with our spiritual gift(s)." What would you say so far? "I have a gift????!!!" Sorry Lord," or "Yes Jesus, thank you so much. It has been an honor to use my gift to build up my church."

Are you wondering about your gift(s)? Here are some of the specific gifts listed in the Bible: administration, apostle, discernment, encouragement, evangelism, faith, giving, healing, service, hospitality, knowledge, leadership, mercy, music, pastoring, prophesy, teaching, tongues, wisdom, and there are others. Paul exhorts us not to be ignorant about this vital aspect of our Christian life together. You have one or more of these gifts residing in you at this very moment. They have been hand picked for you to do good work in the church and the world.

Here are some possible responses to this article;

1. You can ask God to reveal your spiritual gifts, by praying right now.
2. You can test out one of the gifts listed above by taking specific action in say...hospitality, giving, mercy, or whatever gift you are sensing for the next few months. If you do it with ease and joy that is a clear affirmation.
3. You can ask a mature Christian what they think your gifts might be.
4. You can take a spiritual gift survey. You can find them online, or you can get one from me.

## *PROMISE KEEPERS 2008*

**Promise Keepers (PK)**, the international ministry to men, will hold its high energy men's conference in seven cities in 2008, including Fresno, marking 18 years of life-transforming events in sports arenas across the United States. The theme for the gatherings is "Manhood '08: Let the Truth Be Told," and is set for June 27-28, 2008.

The program runs Friday evening from 6:30 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. and on Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

**“The concept of manhood** itself is under assault in our culture,” said Dr. Tom Fortson, president and CEO of Promise Keepers. “Fewer and fewer children are being raised under the influence of their fathers, and without a constructive masculine role model. Sexuality is totally distorted. We need help with our identity and priorities, and Promise Keepers events help men address these issues like no other experience.”

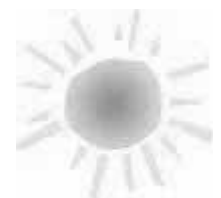

### SESSION NOTES by Mo Graham

Session has been concerned about the church finances, particularly since the giving for the first few months of this year is thousands of dollars less than last year. The Session has committed to pray daily for individual and family finances in our congregation, particularly as many are experiencing the effects of increased cost of living expenses, the national economic downturn, and other hardships. The Session is asking each member of the congregation to pray likewise. Please also pray for the church to have sufficient funds to cover ministry expenses.

The Session has been discussing the interconnectedness of the churches programs, and to help frame that discussion is currently reading the book Simple Church by Thom S. Reiner and Eric Geiger. The staff and church deacons are also reading the book. The Session is inviting the deacons, staff and all past elders to read the book and meet together on June 1st for 1 hour after worship to share thoughts and ideas.

A year later, God got a hold of my life and turned me around 180°. I was called to the ministry two years later. My senior year, the school president asked me to be his assistant pastor as he was also the pastor at the local church. After graduating, I received my license to preach with the Assemblies of God. I do not know how long I will be teaching, but I know as long as God wants me to continue, I will. I know that just as Moses and David had their sheep, so I have mine (students).

After a few years with the Assemblies of God, and careful study of scriptures, I felt a need or calling to leave the denomination a take up the Modern Reformation. My first love is studying theology. I love Harvest Community Church and the people God has placed in my life. When we first moved to Madera 6 years ago, we always noticed Harvest Community church felt very drawn to it. Somehow we just knew that this would be our home church. I am honored to serve you as your deacon.

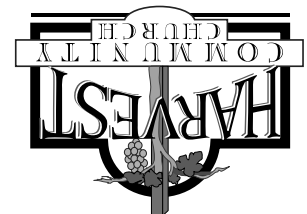
